It has helped me become a more confident public speaker. This has helped me be successful with presentations in school, in debate club, and everyday life.

I've been involved with Easter Seals since I was 13 years old and the opportunities that I have been able to avail of are immeasurable. I've been involved with Wheelchair Basketball, Swimming, Overnight Camps, Camp Days, Family Days, and Socials, to name a few. Through Easter Seals, I was introduced to boccia - a paralympic sport that is like lawn bowling or curling that is played indoors. I love the game and have been able to travel to Quebec and Ontario to compete nationally. This year at the 2024 Canadian National Boccia Championships I won the prestigious Gilles Henry Spirit of the Game Award. I am also now a member of the 2025 Boccia Canada National Espoir Team and will be representing Canada in Brazil this March in the 2025 World Youth Boccia Championship. This is all thanks to the staff, volunteers, and participants at Easter Seals, who allowed me to learn how to play boccia and provided me with equipment and a fully accessible facility where I can practice.

Easter Seals is like that - the moment you walk in, your disability is left outside the door because the building, amphitheater, and park are fully accessible. The entire facility allows me to be independent and able to participate in anything I want to do. My Easter Seals friends and I get to live our best lives because we have a safe, inclusive place where we are free to enjoy life barrier-free - all made possible because of your generosity!

I have seen firsthand how much work the volunteers and staff put into these programs. The impact they have had on my life has inspired me to give back, and now I regularly volunteer, too. I have volunteered at Summer Day Camp, attended Youth Overnight Camp, and Junior Boccia every week. 

Meet Rhea

Rhea, age 14 from Mount Pearl, doesn't let her visual impairment stop her. From Boccia to Rock Climbing to Swimming to Dansability, Rhea does it all and we have Easter Seals NL to thank for that. Not only are the programs amazing but so are the incredible staff and volunteers. They are all so supportive and kind. Rhea also loves the Socials, Youth Camp, Christmas Party and of course, Celebrate the Season with Shanneyganock is always at the top of Rhea's bucket list. In 2018, Rhea's ophthalmologist told us, shortly after genetic testing provided a diagnosis of Noonan Syndrome (a unique genetic condition), that her vision was deteriorating rapidly with no explanation. There is no known direct link between the vision loss and her genetic condition, but both present challenges for Rhea. Each diagnosis created immense fear for her future.

Finding out about Easter Seals, through the CNIB, gave us a sense of relief. Knowing that Rhea would still have access to incredible opportunities was a blessing in a time of turmoil. Easter Seals encourages each participant to strive to achieve whatever they want while highlighting individual strengths. Easter Seals has been a big part of Rhea being able to try new activities, gaining new skills, increasing her confidence & encouraging her independence. Rhea has made so many wonderful friends through Easter Seals and we are so grateful to be a part of the Easter Seals community!





Meet Kaiden

Kaiden is an energetic, social and out going 14 year old from Bay Bulls. From the moment Kaiden made his way into this world he showed the world he was a fighter. The Janeway was his second home for his first years. With many appointments and stays; from NICU, illnesses and multiple surgeries. Kaiden was born with a cleft pallet and crainiosynotosis which came with an NG tube and a whole team of Doctors. Both his Cleft Pallet and Crainiosynostosis were able to be successfully repaired. As major issues were slowly resolved it was more apparent that Kaiden had hearing and vision difficulties. Kaiden was found to be legally blind and have profound hearing loss.

With all this Kaiden has and continues to overcome roadblocks and surpass many expectations with confidence and determination. This confidence comes from the many groups Kaiden has been involved with. Easter Seals being one of those groups that embraces all ages allowing each person to be themselves. The support from the programs/events, staff, peers and families has offered opportunities for Kaiden that may have been otherwise missed.

One of Kaiden's favourite events is Celebrate the Season, where he was given the opportunity to shine on stage. There are no words for the confidence Kaiden walked off that stage with, Easter Seals is more than just a building or group. Easter Seals is a family, each program/event goes beyond the activity, you not only see but feel the impact Easter Seals has on each individual as they try something new for the first time, reach a goal or just meet someone new. Meet Ava

Ava Walsh is 22 years old and has been a participant of Easter Seals NL for the past 10 years. Ava has Down Syndrome which has cognitive as well as physical implications on her health. Ava required open heart surgery due to a congenital heart defect and chemotherapy for a type of leukaemia associated with Down Syndrome. Ava has overcome these challenges and continues to thrive. She is very active in the community and truly enjoys her recreational experiences.

Ava first started out with Easter Seals by attending Summer Day Camp. This was invaluable as there was no other inclusive option for her age group in the summer. Day Camp allowed her to participate in meaningful activities during the summer months when other more traditional youth day camps weren't appropriate and staying home would have been lonely and boring. She went on to attend overnight camp which was the very first time she stayed on her own away from her family! This was a huge learning experience for her and a big confidence boost. Ava would not have had that opportunity were it not for Easter Seals.

Ava currently participates in individual music lessons with Easter Seals and is learning to play the drums. This was a goal she set for herself and she received a drum set for Christmas so that she can practice at home! She played the drums for a packed house at the Easter Seals Christmas Concert. She also just picked up Target Shooting with Easter Seals and has excelled in that sport. She looks forward to attending every week and is very proud to bring home her targets to show us her success.

Easter Seals has provided Ava with programs to support her abilities and interests at various stages of her development. These opportunities improve her quality of life and help her learn new skills and provide meaningful social relationships. We are very thankful for all the programs that Easter Seals provides.



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Meet Max

Max is a very social and happy 9-year-old boy. Days before his 4th birthday he was officially diagnosed with Autism. While navigating the many early intervention services that would now open up to Max, we were introduced to Easter Seals NL.

From the moment of our very first meeting with Easter Seals we were met with open arms, and acceptance. Max began attending Let's Get Active, and almost immediately the pandemic lock down began. Easter Seals provided ways for our family to stay busy and active together, even when lock down meant we could not attend in person. Despite the challenges of those early pandemic years, Max has flourished, and looks forward to attending Let's Get Active on Saturday mornings.

As Max has grown, so too has his participation in activities offered by Easter Seals. He has been a regular participant in swimming lessons, and has attended two weeks of Summer Day Camp each summer since starting school. Summer Day Camp allows Max to experience typical Summer Day Camp activities, in a welcoming and inclusive environment. Max loves the on-site playground, and playing games in the gym. Trunk or Treat, and the Family Christmas Party are highlights of Max's year.

Max began Music Therapy a few years ago, with the goal of attending individual music lessons in the community. When he was ready to graduate to "real" music lessons, Easter Seals was our first choice. Max has been learning piano in Individual Creative Expressions Music, and had his first ever performance at the 2024 Creative Expressions Music and Dance Showcase. The opportunity to perform was very special to Max, boosting his selfesteem, and confidence. As parents we could not be more proud of all he has accomplished.

From those early days, when Max was non-verbal, to a now very chatty 9-year-old, Easter Seals has been there every step of the way, offering programs that have been a very important part of Max's social, emotional, and physical development. The staff and volunteers have been amazing, and Easter Seals truly feels like family. We are so grateful to the donors who support Easter Seals, and the important work that they do in our community.



Meet Angela

Our daughter, **Angela**, joined Easter Seals NL upon moving from Ottawa in 2022. While Angela was born in Ottawa, she has been raised in a traditional Newfoundland home, surrounded by music and laughter.

Angela was greatly influenced by her two brothers growing up, both of whom loved and played music. They taught her to play drums, sing, and perform confidently while having fun playing RockBand, always including her.

The trio (James, Jacob, and Angela), as Angela calls them, formed a band called "Knott so Bad." The band played for several years at Angela's elementary talent show, giving her an introduction to performing on stage. As Angela puts it, "I was born to perform."

As parents, we want our children to be happy and successful, and to have the opportunity to shine. Easter Seals NL offered that opportunity, and for that, we are so thankful. We have a profound appreciation for all the life-changing work that Easter Seals NL provides to our community. Our experience was so inspiring that we hope others will have the same fulfilling experience.

When Angela heard she was chosen to perform with Shanneyganock in the annual Celebrate the Season fundraiser concert for Easter Seals, she was overjoyed. Building on a Growing Love for Music

Creative Expressions Music at Easter Seals has seen exciting developments in 2024. The program now offers expanded opportunities for musical creativity and expression to participants of all ages, abilities, and interests.

Initially, music sessions were offered as individual or group sessions. However, as the program grew, it became clear that we needed to expand our group music offerings. Joanna, a participant in Creative Expressions Music, shared, "Group music is important because I get to sing with my friends, and it makes me feel happy." Engaging in group singing has a transformative effect, fostering both musical skills and friendships. In the summer of 2024, we responded to this need by expanding our Group Music Program, and introducing four new offerings.

Music & Me

Music & Me is a group music session designed to create a fun, vibrant, and engaging environment. Participants, accompanied by their guardians and support workers, sing along to their favorite songs while exploring the many exciting aspects of musical expression.

Musically Motivated Youth Group

This new youth group provides an immersive environment where participants can explore a variety of musical instruments. Over multiple sessions, participants learn to play instruments in a supportive and encouraging setting, fostering collaboration and creativity.

Music & Movement Youth Group

Designed for participants who love to express themselves through movement, this energetic program allows participants to sing along, explore music, and move freely while playing their favorite instruments.

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Easter Seals Choir

The possibilities and opportunities that music brings are endless. The summer of 2024 also marked the launch of the Easter Seals Choir. The power of group singing is contagious, and the choir provides participants with the opportunity to develop vocal skills, musical phrasing, and breath control. This addition has been a great success, offering exciting performance opportunities.

In December, the Easter Seals Choir performed at Celebrate the Season, our Music and Dance Showcase, as well as at the Avalon Mall, where they were invited to sing Christmas carols. Melissa, a choir participant, shared, "Singing in the choir feels good, is more personalized, and helps me learn more music."

Music is universal and should be enjoyed by everyone. Ava, another participant in Creative Expressions Music, expressed that she loves "having fun in music" and always "enjoys herself." We are thrilled about the continued growth of this wonderful program and look forward to even more musical moments in the future.

In 2011, Claire started Music Therapy at Easter Seals NL when she wasn't even two years old yet!

For our family, this was a new experience—meeting other families and children who were living similar lives, sharing experiences, and needing extra support while simply trying to find a place to belong and be included.

Fourteen years later, here we are. Claire now participates in seven programs weekly, including Boccia, Wall Climbing, Wheelchair Basketball, Target Shooting, Dansability, Creative Expression Music, and Sledge Hockey. These programs are designed with adaptive equipment to help her successfully take part and thrive—and is she ever thriving!

We watched our little girl go from a verbally limited toddler to a confident 15-year-old young lady who has found her voice and her confidence! Most recently, she performed in front of an audience at the 2024 Fall Dansability & Music and Dance Showcase and on stage at *Celebrate the Season*!

Claire lives with Cerebral Palsy, Epilepsy, Autism, PTSD, and is also medically complex. Despite all of that, she loves to stay busy, laugh, and have fun. Having a place where she feels included, where her needs are met, where she can see her friends, and where she can take part in activities that would otherwise not be available to her means everything. She is so proud and happy to be part of this community.

As a family, we look forward to summer family camps, fun family days, and any opportunity to connect with people who have become a valuable part of our lives.

When you ask Claire what she loves about Easter Seals NL, she'll say, "You know, our building with my friends."

Aside from the hospital, where we spend a lot of time, Easter Seals NL is the focal point of our lives—especially Claire's. We are grateful for the opportunities and programs available through Easter Seals NL. We are thankful for the connections we have made and continue to make. Most importantly, we have watched our daughter grow into a strong, independent young woman, finding a place in a community where she truly belongs."

Swimming provides a whole-body workout that is especially beneficial for her as a wheelchair user. With assistance, she can stand in the water and strengthen her arms and legs, which she is unable to do otherwise.

Working with an Easter Seals NL volunteer oneon-one ensures Valerie's safety in the water and allows for a personalized approach that focuses on her specific needs and goals. From learning to put her head underwater to floating and general water safety, the volunteer is there to make the experience fun and enjoyable.

Valerie loves connecting with the volunteers, getting to know them, and building trusting relationships, which enables us, as parents, to comfortably watch from the sidelines. The swimming program through Easter Seals NL makes it easy for our family to get Valerie the exercise she needs while also teaching her important water skills. This program has made a significant difference in Valerie's life. We are grateful for the opportunity and appreciate all the effort that goes into organizing the sessions and recruiting volunteers.

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From Ice Skates to Sledge Slates: How a Life on Ice Took a Cool New Turn!



I have been a figure skater my entire life and a figure skating coach for the past 17 years. Since I do not have immediate family living close by, a significant part of my social support comes from the figure skating community and the relationships I have built within that circle since moving to St. John's in 2002.

In May 2021, I was diagnosed with a Grade 2 Spinal Ependymoma, a tumor located within my spinal cord. My mobility rapidly declined, and following surgery, I found myself paralyzed. This experience turned my world upside down, and one of my biggest concerns was how I would continue to make a meaningful contribution to the skating world.

After extensive rehabilitation and ongoing physiotherapy, I began to regain my strength and was eager to return to the rink. Several people suggested that I try sledge skating. At first, I was unsure how to pursue this and hesitant to invest in my own sled without knowing if I would enjoy it. By coincidence, Dayna, an employee of Easter Seals who I had previously coached as a figure skater, was on a virtual seminar with me where the topic of accessing sleds came up. She informed me that Easter Seals NL had an Equipment Loan Program, allowing me to borrow a sled. Knowing this, I felt a renewed sense of hope about returning to the ice. Soon after, a member of Skate NL, our provincial skating organization, reached out to Dayna and the staff on my behalf, and I was promptly fitted for a sled. I began to adjust to it through my local skating club's programming and was able to return to coaching this season, all thanks to Easter Seals NL's Equipment Loan Program. Access to this equipment has truly been life-changing, and the benefits to my physical and mental health are immeasurable.

June 2024 marked my 40th birthday, and my husband, best friends, and family threw me a skating party—something I had wanted my entire

life. When I turned 36, I was uncertain if I would reach this milestone birthday, so being able to celebrate my stable health, the amazing community around me, and my passion for ice skating all at once was extremely emotional.

I want to express my gratitude to Easter Seals for making my life more rewarding than I ever thought possible as someone who is newly experiencing a disability. Access to the sledge through Easter Seals NL's Equipment Loan Program has provided me with the opportunity and purpose I needed while facing life's biggest challenges.

The chance to let them shine on the court—where they truly belong—was too good to pass up.

During halftime, the **Dansability** group from Easter Seals NL took center court. Volunteers ensured the dancers felt comfortable and ready to perform. The music began, and the dancers—stepping or rolling to the beat—performed with joy and energy, led by Leah Beaumaster, Board Director and Dansability Lead.

"My name is Leah Beaumaster, and I am the lead for the Dansability program and a member of the Board of Directors with ESNL. I have had the privilege of teaching Easter Seals participants dance and watching them grow significantly in their confidence and performance skills. Our Dansability class was invited by the Rogues Basketball team to perform at Inclusion Night.

The participants were so excited for the opportunity to perform their dance moves in front of a larger audience and to sit courtside to watch the basketball game! There were some nerves initially among the participants when they saw the big stage, but their confidence shone through once they got out on the court. Plant Seeds Today for Tomorrow's Success

Living in Roddickton on the Great Northern Peninsula, I have seen quite several Indigenous youths come to our community through the foster system and the struggles that some of them have faced. Add a disability, and the barriers some of these youths face only increase. As an employer and an educator, I believe that if you can help provide an opportunity for someone to learn, grow, and better themselves, you should do so.

Brooklyn Kajuatsiak is a young man who finished high school with a school-leaving certificate. That means he did not have the skills to acquire credits like most students. To be employed, he would need a higher level of supervision and guidance and a job that fits his abilities. I knew I would need outside support to give Brooklyn a chance to succeed in employment. Enter Easter Seals NL and its Opportunities Fund Program.

To be honest, I wasn't aware of Easter Seals NL or their employment services. My wife purchased a ticket on the Luxury Cabin Lottery, so I thought I would contact them to see if they could help. I spoke to Easter Seals NL staff Paula Hayes and Rachel Warren who deliver Easter Seals NL's Opportunities Fund Program. Their support has allowed Brooklyn to gain meaningful employment and skills that will benefit him throughout his life.

Working alongside my Dad, Freeman Cull, Brooklyn gained experience in organic gardening and beekeeping! He developed skills to grow fruits and vegetables, make fertilizer out of kelp, maintain a garden, and assist a bee colony with 50,000 bees. Brooklyn's work ethic is outstanding. He tackles tasks with vigor, enthusiasm, and a smile. Brooklyn's chosen mom, his foster mom, Paula, witnessed Brooklyn's increased confidence, a love for going to work, and an excellent relationship between him and my Dad. With this new confidence, Brooklyn aspires to obtain his driver's license!

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I just want to give a big bouquet to Easter Seals for their support of Brooklyn. He is a quality individual who just needed someone to advocate for him. I'm proud to have done so and incredibly appreciative of the support from Easter Seals' Opportunities Fund. 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


